



Dear Olympia Fields Park District Patrons

Starting in October 2016, the Olympia Fields Park District started renovating the Barn building. We are relocating the bathrooms, making them larger and more accessible. We are also doubling the size of our kitchen, making it perfect for rental caterers or for a small cooking class. We are also making the front desk more visible and accessible to the public. Finally, we are adding a brand new multi-purpose room for all types of classes. Some other updates the facility is getting are an updated HVAC system, new landscaping, and additional space added to the Barn room for larger groups and rentals. The target date for completion of the facility will be May 2017. With this additional space, we will be able to hold at least 200 people inside the barn. New rental fees will be in place to rent the space, and will be available for inquiry starting in October 2016.





Due to construction, many programs daily activities normally held in the Barn building will be affected. Our front office will be transferred over to the Cull House building in the fall, since the office in the barn will be renovated. Also, during construction, the meeting rooms will be inaccessible, so classes will have to be located to the Cull House, or another facility off-site. The north parking lot will be the main location for the construction equipment, so visitors parking will be restricted to the south parking area. Our board meetings will be temporarily relocated to the Old Village Hall (address is 20701 Governors Highway, which is on the corner of Governors Highway & Scott Drive, across the street from Tolentine Park). Park Board meetings are held the 3rd Tuesday of every month at 6:00 pm.

We hope that you are as excited about the renovations to our building, and we ask for your patience over the next 7 months. We will continue to offer you our very best in programming and rental space now and into the future. We hope that you stop by once our construction has completed, and take a look at all the things we have updated and added!




Sock Hop Hustle 5K Sunday, May 14, 2017

Tolentine Park Attendant

Tolentine Park Staff duties include taking admission and monitoring the Splash Pad. They are responsible for enforcing rules of the park and promoting the park district, their programs, and events. Staff are responsible for monitoring the entire park and keeping it safe and clean.

Tolentine Park is open year round. The Community Garden generally is busy from early May through the end of October, and the Splash Pad is open 7 days a week from Memorial Day to Labor Day, weather permitting. The playground, Basketball courts and passive play areas are busy year round. Staff generally work around the Splash Pad hours and will be outside the entire shift. They will mostly be standing, walking and bending. This position generally starts 2 weeks before Memorial Day and ends the week after Labor Day. There are no minimum hours per week.



Summer Camp Counselor

This is a high-energy position for those who love children! We look for energetic, active, and creative applicants who aren't afraid to interact with the children while constantly insuring the safety of all campers and staff. Creative and positive discipline techniques are a must. This position will assist in creating the daily schedule, and be able to, come up with new activities on the spot.

First-Aid and CPR/AED certifications are required and training will be available. This position is responsible for getting out the equipment and supplies for all activities, as well as cleaning and storing all equipment and supplies at the end of the day. Typically, Camp Counselors work Monday - Friday for up to 35 hours per week. Staff will be outside and on their feet the majority of the job. Summer Camp runs for 8 weeks, and there is at least one week prior to camp for training.

Seasonal Maintenance

The maintenance department does a variety of park labor duties in order to maintain park properties and equipment. Seasonal staff must be able to work solely or in teams. They will perform work at a moderate, constant pace, depending on the demands of the job required. Work can start as early as March 1, and has the potential to continue through the end of October. Assigned hours will depend on scheduled work and weather.

Applicants must hold a clean and valid Illinois Driver's License and have reliable transportation, must be able to lift 50 lbs. frequently, and team lift up to 70 lbs. infrequently. All seasonal staff must be able to work any assigned hours from 6:00 am - 10:0 pm, and be available to work Monday - Sunday, weekends and holidays included.

Research:

During the past several months, Illinois Association of Park Districts has been working closely with aQity Research & Insights to analyze the results of an IAPD-funded survey pertaining to the W-2 employment and revenue data of IAPD member agencies.

The report contains impressive statewide results, including key finding such as:

- Park districts, forest preserves, conservation districts, and special recreation agencies employ more than **67,000 people statewide**.
- These jobs represent nearly \$720 million paid in wages and compensation.
- More than 62% of an agency's employees live within the district where they work.
- Roughly half of these jobs provide important early work experience for younger adults (ages 25 and under).
- Statewide, just over half of agency revenues come from non-tax sources, including earned revenue (program fees and memberships) and other sources (grants, donations, interest, etc.)

South Suburban Special Recreation Association (SSSRA) is a therapeutic recreation program that is an extension of the Olympia Fields Park District. SSSRA is organized to provide individuals with special needs or disabilities the opportunity to be involved in year round recreation programs.

SSSRA programs are for individuals from birth through adult who are in special education classes, sheltered workshops or whom have recreational needs not met by traditional park district programs.

Persons residing in SSSRA member agency communities are considered residents. These agencies are: Country Club Hills Park District, Frankfort Square Park District, Hazel Crest Park District, Homewood-Flossmoor Park District, Lan-Oak Park District, Matteson Parks & Recreation Department, Oak Forest Park District, Olympia Fields Park District, Park Forest Recreation & Parks Department, Richton Park Parks & Recreation Department, and Tinley Park-Park District.

Programs and special events are offered seasonally throughout the year. They include programs in the areas of Early Childhood Development, Cultural Arts, Illinois Special Olympics, Summer Day Camp, Sports & Fitness, Social Programs, Adaptive Sports, Special Events and Overnight Trips.

A complete program brochure is available at the Olympia Fields Park District and the SSSRA office. Please call the SSSRA office if you would like to receive the SSSRA brochure on a seasonal basis.

Professional staff with experience in the field of Therapeutic Recreation or a related field supervise all SSSRA programs. They are assisted by individuals who are trained by SSSRA staff in specific areas of therapeutic recreation.

Scholarships are available to SSSRA residents with disabilities who would like to participate in one or more programs, but cannot afford the fees charged. Through the Inclusion process, SSSRA staff members are available to help participants choose an appropriate program, conduct staff trainings, or supply adaptive equipment if you or a family member is interested in a park district or recreation department program.

Due to the generosity of the Aileen S. Andrew Foundation, door-to-door transportation for this program is offered free of charge for residents.




Teen parties or large groups require additional security fees. All outdoor rentals that will have 100 or more attendees must be approved by the park board.

Registration Policies

- 1. Proof of residency (utility or tax bill) will be checked by the Park District staff upon registration.
- 2. Park District residents receive a discounted rate, as they pay taxes to the district.
- 3. Any applicant or participant may be required at any time to provide reasonable proof of age, residency, marital status or dependency.
- 4. You must complete the registration form and submit with full payment when registering for a program.
- Registration is accepted at the Park District office (The Barn) located at: 20712 Western Avenue Olympia Fields, IL 60461
- 6. Online registration is available on the district website: www.ofparks.org.
- 7. Drop-Off Registration You may use the white drop box located to the right of the mail box outside the Cull House. This box is accessible 24 hours a day.
- 8. Pre-registration is necessary for most Park District programs.
- 9. All registration is done on a first come, first served basis. No space will be reserved until the appropriate program fee is paid.
- Payment is accepted in the form of: cash, check, money order or credit card (Visa or MasterCard). Please make checks payable to: Olympia Fields Park District.
- 11. A \$35 fee will be charged for any returned check. Only cash will be taken in place of the NSF check.
- Checks which are not cashed within the 90 day timeframe and need to be reprinted, will be charged a \$20 administrative fee.

- 13. Program Fees will not be prorated when registering for a program if the class session has already started or you cannot attend the class dates as listed.
